REPORT ON RESOLUTION NO. 7754 CONCERNING THE TASK FORCE ON CHRISTIAN LIFE STYLE AND ECOLOGY Received by the General Assembly

The 1977 General Assembly approved Resolution No. 7754 which called upon the Administrative Committee to establish a task force on Christian life style and ecology. The Administrative Committee, not being structured for programmatic functions, asked the Division of Homeland Ministries to participate in the establishment of the task force. The Division accepted the request to appoint and assume administrative responsibility for the task force. It authorized the DHM staff to begin the process of selection and budgeting, with the understanding that the task force would be implemented as funding was available to the Division for the task force's operation. DHM has made a capital distribution for 1979 operations and the 1980 DHM budget will include the task force.
