On this day, we remember how God created from the firmament of the deep, and say that:

All: "Water is sacred, water is life!"

In the days of Noah, you washed away evil from the face of the earth through weeks of rain, so that today we claim:

In the time of Moses and Miriam, you led your people to the surging sea, and led your people into freedom crossing into new life, so we can say:
